

Vehicle Examiners



Introduction

As part of the Tasmanian Government's 2018 election commitment, from 1st February in addition to a reduction of fees, the permitted days of use available to a conditionally registered motor vehicle under the Special Interest Vehicle registration scheme have been increased.

Permitted days of use have been increased to 104 days within a 12 month registration period or if registered for a 6 month period, 52 days of use. An increase in Special Interest Vehicle enquiries or inspections at an AIS may occur as a consequence of the scheme changes.

Background;

As a result of the changes of use, the Special Interest Vehicle Handbook has been amended and is available from the following website;

The Light Vehicle AIS Procedures Manual Special Interest Vehicle Registration Scheme section has also been amended to reflect the reduction of fees, permitted days of use and to provide a general overview of the scheme.

The Light Vehicle Inspection Manual (LVIM) has been amended to further clarify the application process and to provide supporting information to assist a Vehicle Examiner in determining a vehicles suitability for conditional registration. This information is within Section 18 of the LVIM.

The amended LVIM is the January 2019 version with this and the Light Vehicle AIS Procedures Manual available from the Transport Tasmania website at;
