Taxi drivers	Where an operator provides a wheelchair accessible taxi (WAT) service, all of its drivers will be required to undertake training in the provision of safe WAT services.  All other mandatory training requirements will be removed.	Administrative
	Continue to be required to undergo a medical check on initial application and then every three years.  Subject to the success of the wider roll-out of medical self-declarations, the process could be expanded to taxi drivers.	Administrative
All drivers	As part of their annual ancillary certificate renewal, all drivers will be required to declare that they understand and will comply with their public passenger vehicle legislative obligations, as well as their requirements under disability/anti-discrimination legislation.	Administrative
