Temporary Traffic Management Devices in Tasmania

Approval of Temporary Traffic Management Devices in Tasmania:

The original scope of the Austroads Guide to Temporary Traffic Management included a dedicated part of the Guide for device approval. Austroads also had a national working group in the scope to assess and approve temporary traffic management devices.

Due to the complexity of a national approach and other considerations, the Austroads project team removed this part of the Guide before its release in December 2019. Each jurisdiction is now responsible for assessing and approving the use of temporary traffic management devices.

Austroads will develop a national assessment scheme for traffic control devices to harmonise practice and reduce the burden associated with individual jurisdictional assessments. Once this scheme is developed, Tasmania will implement this national scheme.

The Department of State Growth is currently responsible for assessing temporary traffic management devices intended for use on public roads in Tasmania.

A process has been created to assess and provide approval or advice to contractors and suppliers.

Contractors or suppliers who wish to utilise or supply new or improved temporary traffic management devices must submit the device for assessment through the **Transport and Infrastructure Group Temporary Traffic Management Working Group** (TIG TTMWG).

Devices covered under AS1742.3 Manual of uniform traffic control devices, Part 3: Traffic control for works on roads and the Austroads Guide to Temporary Traffic Management (AGTTM) do not have to go through this process.
